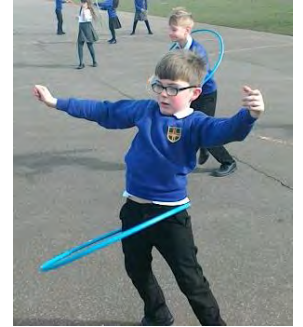
### Sport Relief
