
Children who are in Curie and Einstein class need to have their swimming kit every Thursday.

We have been studying fractions for the past two weeks and have been really pleased with how the children's understanding of this concept has been coming along. Most children have enjoyed using fraction walls to find equivalent fractions!



Reading

This term, in order to improve the children's reading, we have created a competition between all the classes on who can 'grow' the best flower. Each week, we will take the % of children who are reading 3 times a week in each class and use this to build their class flower. Week 1 was about roots. As Einstein came first with 69% of their children reading at least 3 times per week, their flower grew 4 roots. Second were Curie on 59% and 3 roots, third were Keller on 58% and 2 roots with finally Owens on 33% and 1 root. We are really encouraging the children to keep up with their reading so their plant will be the strongest!
