### RE Week

Children have been learning about humanism and Christianity this week. And with this focus, they have been grappling with our big Philosophical question 'How do people make moral decisions?' Firstly, the children discussed how we can be more philosophical. The children decided that to be philosophical they needed to be able to communicate effectively including actively listening. To demonstrate this, children tried to do a 'blind drawing' where they were given instructions by a partner (see below). After this the children looked at how people come to make



moral decisions. Discussion then turned to how Christians make moral decisions and how they can use the teachings of Jesus and the bible to help them. Children looked at the parable of the Good Samaritan and what that could tell us about how people make decisions. Discussions then turned to why Jesus uses parables instead of just telling people what to do. This work on Christianity was then compared with humanism. We discovered that there are some key similarities between humanism and Christianity notably that they both say that you should treat others as you would like to be treated. The end of the week finished with a diary entry where children looked back on decisions they have made and how what they have learnt this week
