Hammer Stone- A large, hard, round stone that is used to bash other stones into shape.

Antler- The bony horn part of a deer or moose.

Fur Pelt- The skin and fur of a Stone Age animal that is used for clothing and blankets.

Flint- A stone that can be made sharp by hitting it (knapping) using a hammer stone.

Mammoth- a large elephant with huge tusks and a woolly coat.

Band- A group of Stone Age people that live together in a community.



KEY FACTS

- The Stone Age started half a million years ago.
- The Stone Age people were hunter gatherers. This meant that they moved around often following herds of animals such as deer.
- Tools such as axes and spears, were very important and were usually made from wood and stone (flint).
- Deer antlers were used for making bowls and cups.
- There was very little technology as we know it today. However, the design of a modern axe in very similar to axes in the Stone Age.
