English

As part of our English we have been creating narratives about the Stone Age. The children have been really trying hard with their work by making sure they include fantastic vocabulary as well as being accurate with their punctuation.

Topic

We are starting to wind up our Stone Age topic. We are looking at Dereham and Norfolk in the Stone Age. We have found out that there was a land bridge in the Palaeolithic and Mesolithic periods that connected parts of what is now Norfolk to France. The children have learnt about some of the fascinating artefacts and places in Norfolk including the Happisburgh hand axe, Grimes Graves and Sea Henge. A replica of Sea Henge is at Kings Lynn Museum and you can also visit Grimes Graves.
