Topic...

Our topic this half term is Ancient Greece. We have been exploring what the greatest legacy of the period is. So far we have explored Democracy and asked the question, Was Ancient Greek democracy really democracy? We found out that while Athens was the birthplace of democracy, it was very different to the democracy we know today. Did you know that the word democracy comes from the Greek words Dêmos (which means people) and krátos (which means rule or strength.). However, only Athenian men who were not slaves were eligible to vote.

Maths... Pi day - Monday 14th March

On Pi day we explored pi is and what it is used for. As part of this we explored the Babylonian number system where they use base 60 instead of the base 10 that we use today. We practised writing different numbers using the two symbols that the Babylonians used. In the afternoon, we learnt about different mathematicians and produced a poster about the one who most inspired us. We had a superb day!
