Maths

The children have finished their work on fractions for the time being. This week they learnt all about how to add and subtract fractions with the same denominators. They also revisited their work on placing fractions on a number line and we even looked at how some fractions are equivalent E.g. $\frac{1}{2}$ and $\frac{2}{4}$. Next week we move back to looking at place value and the four operations which are so key to maths.

Homework expectations

Children in Year 3 and 4 are expected to read 3 times per week for 15 minutes. At this age around half the time the children should be reading to an adult to check understanding and fluency.

Currently we have around 40% of children doing this. Children who do not do at least 3 reads per week, will now be invited to reading club during their break times to make up the time.

Geography

Our topic at the moment is mainly focussed on Geography. Children have enjoyed identifying the different settlement types (hamlet, village, town, and city) as well as revising their knowledge on counties. We have also made replica maps of Dereham town centre outside with chalk and discussed vital infrastructure like benches, bins, lamp posts and traffic lights.
