



On Site Activities: We recommend that a supervising adult is present with each group during activities. Some Local Authorities/Associations insist on this, so please check with your relevant stakeholders.


Off Site Activities: There must be at least one supervising adult from your school/group present for all off-site activities, excursions and field work.






Why read with older children?

#### Reading aloud

- practises oracy skills and confidence

#### Reading together

- promotes positive attitude to reading
- shared experience

#### Discussion

- clarifies comprehension
- builds culture capital
- encourages curiosity


Read to your child: English or home language.

#### But technology can affect children's development...

- Sleep cycles are affected by blue light from screens
- Screen-based entertainment increases central nervous system arousal
- Millennials are more forgetful than OAP's
- One study found that the more distracted you are the less able you are to experience empathy

### Digital Responsibility

#### Checklist



Make use of the parental controls on your home broadband and any internet-enabled devices. You can find out how at your broadband provider's website or by visiting internetmatters.org.



Use safe search engines such as swiggle.org.uk or kids-search.com. Safe search settings can also be activated on Google and other search engines as well as YouTube. You can find out more at google. co.uk/safetycentre.

#### Agree boundaries

Be clear what your child can and can't do online - where they can use the internet, how much time they can spend online, the sites they can visit and the type of information they can share. Agree with your child when they can have a mobile phone or tablet.

Over 65 % of parents are most concerned about their 6-10 viewing inappropriate content online\*



#### Explore together

The best way to find out what your child is doing online is to ask them to tell you about it. Encourage them to use devices in communal areas so you can see what sites they're visiting and share with them.

#### Check if it's suitable

The age ratings that come with games, apps, films and social networks are a good guide to whether they're suitable for your child. The minimum age limit is 13 for several social networking sites, including Facebook and Instagram.
