Whole School Newsletter—Spring Term 2

Dear Parents and Carers,

As we approach the end of another busy term, I want to take the opportunity to say how proud we are of all our pupils. We have seen our school values being demonstrated widely across the school this term and it has been great to see the progress our children are making in their learning.

We have also seen children represent the school at a range of sporting events, showing great sportsmanship and teamwork and really enjoying competing against other schools.

Our school council have been busy this term and have organised a 'Crazy Hair' day to raise money for the Princess Trust, where we raised £211 for the charity alongside supporting Comic Relief with a non uniform day where a further £236 was raised. They are now looking at installing a 'buddy bench' to the playground to support children who would like to find new friends to play with at break and lunchtime. We have also seen the launch of our Eco Club, being led by Mrs Birchenall and Mrs Kendall, which the children are enjoying.

Last week, the Bishop of Norwich visited the school to open our 'Good Shepherd's Garden' a project to create a calm, tranquil reflective space for children and staff to use during the day. Alongside the work of contractors for the hard landscaping and installation of fences and seating, there has been a very hardworking team of staff, who over the past 18 months have given up hours of their own time to plant up and grow the garden—the result is amazing. The classes have all been to visit and this will be open at break and lunchtimes from this week for all to enjoy.
