Welcome back to Autumn 2

Another half term of year 6 begins! The children have settled back in and are focussing on their learning well after a little break. They are writing narrative pieces inspired by a Quest story in English. Their first chapter describes the setting and evokes suspense and atmosphere, their second piece will build characters by describing what they do and how they act. In Maths, the children are using fractions, decimals and percentages to describe and calculate parts of a whole. They've completed a set of tests and the children are showing progress in their test technique which is exactly what we have been encouraging them to do. Well done to them for doing the best they could. The information helps us see where we need to help children to plug any gaps in their understanding.

To help the children be SATS ready, your child has a task from each of the 3 SATS practise homework



books they have been given. There is a timetable in front of each book showing which page/s need to be completed each week.

The tasks are linked to the learning we've been doing in school so if your child is struggling, ask them to read the question to you and tell you what they think it means and how they might do it. If they are really stuck and you can't help, children must let us know early in the week so we can help them.

It is also important to keep reading and log it in the reading record as well as learn spellings and practise times tables on TT Rockstars at least once a week.
