
English/Topic

Last week, the children were writing in a journalistic style, to create informative and engaging newspaper reports about the finding of baby woolly mammoth in a Yukon Gold Mine.

This week, they concluded our 'Fossil Hunters' topic by writing an interesting and engaging non-chronological report about a prehistoric animal.

This topic has been really well received by the children—who've demonstrated some super scientific engagement by thinking about Darwin's theory of evolution and the adaptation of birds: exploring how the type of beak and food type influences whether a bird can survive or not.

Maths— Measurement and Statistics

With SATS getting closer, we have been revising our knowledge of measurement and developing our skills of converting from one unit of measurement to another e.g. 145cm = 1.45m

We have also been revising our use of protractors to measure angles accurately and have learnt how to read pie charts using our knowledge of fractions and percentages.

In Ninja maths we have consolidated our knowledge of fractions, decimals and percentages over the last few weeks.
