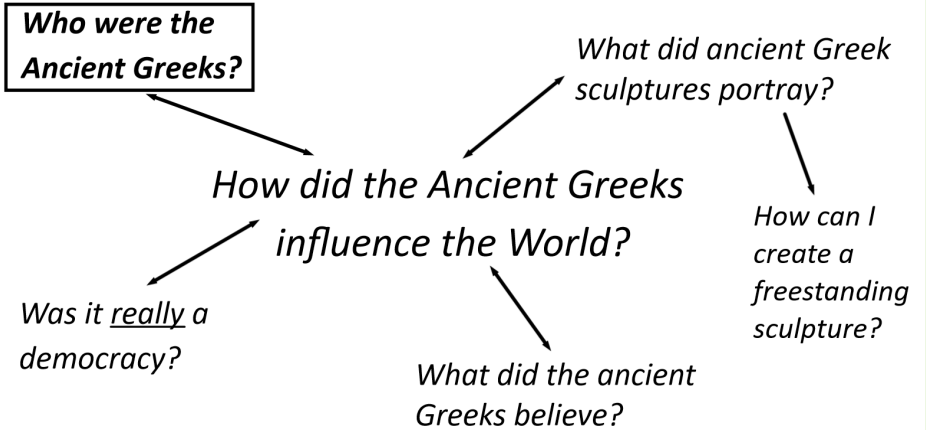




## Topic: Ancient Greeks

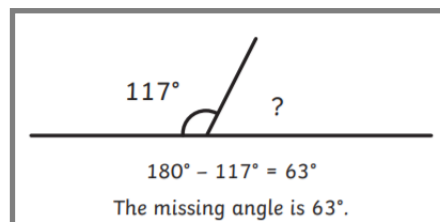
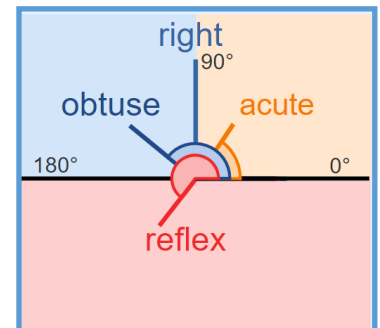
We will be challenging the children to make precise language choices.

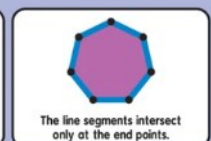
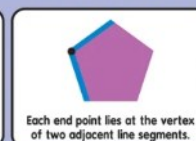
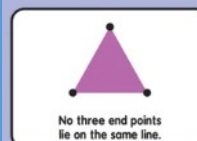
